Eton College

We have enrolled on EtonX's Future Skills Programme which is a suite of online courses providing 7-10 hours of self-study content, covering generic skills useful for students preparing both for higher education and the workplace. We have been able to subscribe to one course which supports students with **creative problem solving**. We would really encourage students to take advantage of this opportunity if possible, as it not only showcases skills beyond examination grades, but completion of the course would be a strong addition to CVs, personal statements and job applications.

Students will be able to login and access the course from **Monday 4th May**. Information on how to login is below:

1. Visit the EtonX website and click [Sign up](#).
2. Choose **Sign up with Access Code**.
3. Enter your Year 11 Access Code: NA6VIAPW
4. Follow the on-screen instructions. Please sign up with your **school email address**.
5. Congratulations! You can now get started on your course.
6. You must have logged in by 31st July to access the course, however there is no deadline for course completion.
