## Arrangements for 20th August 2020 - GCSE Results Day

We decided that we will still expect students to attend the school in order to collect their GCSE results. This is our normal practice and allows students to experience the results amongst their peers, teachers and parents. In order for this to happen safely we have organised the following measures for distribution.

- 1. Students will collect their results in form groups at allocated times.
- 2. We will have 3 distribution areas with a different entrance and exit point.
- 3. Hand sanitiser will be available.
- 4. Students will collect their own GCSE envelope only students (not parents) can collect the envelope. If a student cannot collect their own envelope, for some reason, then they must complete a document that allows their parent to collect it instead. That document is attached in the email and must be brought along on the day.
- 5. Students can then go onto the playground or open the results at home if they wish.

- The GCSE examinations will be in November 2020.
- Exams in November should be of the same number in each subject and in the same format as the summer 2020 exams would have been had they not been cancelled.
- With the exception of Art and Design, grades will be based on exam performance alone, with no non-exam assessment (NEA).
- We will require the exam boards to issue to any student who requests one, a replacement certificate to show the higher of their summer and autumn grades.
- The exam boards must adopt the normal arrangements for reviews of marking and appeals

I hope that this keeps you informed of the latest information and I will see everyone in August.
