One of the key things that the charity are supporting us with is providing more tailored advice and guidance to our Service Premium students to ensure that they have as much information regarding their post-16 options and choices as possible. The team are fully trained and independent Careers Advisors who are specifically employed to support young people from service families. Whilst this may not be the case for all service families, some of our young people re-locate beyond Year 11 and will, therefore, be looking further afield for their post-16 plans. Regardless of whether relocation is a reality for your family, many of our young people from service backgrounds want more tailored advice regarding progression at this key transition time.

At Tomlinscote, we would facilitate your child to have a one to one tailored careers guidance appointment with a trained careers advisor from the charity who would work with them to ensure they have the information they need regarding their next steps.
