Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a lovely start with 300+ new students and I hope they have enjoyed their first few days at Tomlinscote.

I want to highlight our GCSE and Level 2 results this year because the students and school feel very proud indeed. **The 2023 results have been the best the school has ever achieved** and this is despite a drop nationally and within Surrey compared to 2022. The most impressive aspect is our value added measure. This is essentially the PROGRESS that every student makes between KS2 and GCSE. Our progress measure is approximately +0.60 (+0.29 was previously the best last year). This is a massive jump and emphasises that Tomlinscote students are achieving much higher scores compared with other students with the same prior attainment.

In terms of attainment, 23 subjects had 85%+ of the students achieving a GCSE Grade 9-4. It was 91% Grade 9-4 in English, 86% in Maths and 100% in Biology, Chemistry, Mandarin, Physics, Psychology, Religious Studies, Beauty Therapy & Hairdressing, Dance and Child Development. Approximately 40% of all grades overall were Grades 9-7. These are absolutely phenomenal results and continues our upward trajectory in the last few years. Thank you to the past Year 11 students, to all the parents for their support and to my colleagues.

It has been a great start to the year and I hope you enjoy the sunshine this weekend. Good luck to our Greenpower Car team who are racing at Dunsfold Park this weekend.






Consideration to our neighbours
