### Advisers can help with...

- Discussing your career ideas
- Guidance on choosing your GCSE options
- Finding out about college courses
- Exploring university opportunities
- Learning about apprenticeships
- Help with job hunting

## ...But can't

- Provide instant information on anything
- Encourage unrealistic ideas or ambition
- Tell you what to do with your life!



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## Year 11

- All students in Year 11 will have/had a Careers Appointment between Easter of Year 10 and Easter of Year 11.

## Year 11 – What are your options?

• You need to remain in some kind of education until you are 18. This does not mean that you have to go to college full time, you could consider following an apprenticeship programme that allows you to earn and learn at the same time.

#### The 3 main routes to qualifications are:

- A Levels Entry requirements are: 5x 9-4 grades at GCSE (a 6 or higher is required in some subjects). 3-4 subjects are studied over 2 yrs
- Btec & T Levels, vocational subjects Several levels available so entry requirements vary
- Usually one 'industry area' is studied e.g. Hairdressing, Mechanics, I.T
- Apprenticeship Several levels are available so entry requirements vary
- Involves learning the skills for one job in particular





## Year 10

- During the spring and summer terms some year 10 students will be booked in for a careers appointment, if you are in year 10 and would like to have an appointment this year please get in touch:

## How to choose a subject

Do choose a subject because:

- You are interested in the subject and think you would enjoy learning about it
- It is relevant to your career ideas (if you have any don't worry if you don't!)
- It will keep a broad range of options open to you
- You are doing well in the subject
- Your teachers think it is a suitable choice
- You like the way it is assessed
- It will combine well with other subjects and help your general education





## How to choose a subject

*Don't* choose a subject because:

- Your friends are picking it (this doesn't mean that *you* will enjoy it too!)
- You like the teacher (your favourite teacher might leave!)
- You think you *should* do it even though you don't want to
- Your parents think you should take it but it doesn't interest you
- You know someone who has done it and they say it was great (everyone's different!)
- It's thought of as a 'cool' subject by most people
- You think it will be easy
- It sounds good but you haven't really found out about it
