### Year 11 post-16 applications:



It's a busy time for Year 11 with all local post-16 providers putting on their recruitment evenings and open days. We encourage our students to go and see as many of these providers as possible and keep their options open. It is really important that students visit a range of different providers to get a feel for what is the most appropriate choice for them. It's critical that all Year 11s have a plan A and at least one back up option in terms of applications and always keep all their options open. We sent out a long list of all local providers and their open evening dates but highlight some of the key ones for this area below:

- Activate Learning Farnham College: Sat 14<sup>th</sup> Oct 9.30-12.30, Weds 15<sup>th</sup> Nov 4.30-7.30
- Activate Learning Guildford College: Weds 11<sup>th</sup> Oct 4.30-7.30, Sat 11<sup>th</sup> Nov 9.30-12.30
- Activate Learning Merrist Wood College: Sat 18<sup>th</sup> Nov 9.30-12.30
- Collingwood College Sixth Form: Thurs 12<sup>th</sup> Oct 5.30-8.00 (no booking system in place)

• Farnborough College of Technology (FCOT): Farnborough Campus: Weds 11<sup>th</sup> Oct, Thurs 12<sup>th</sup> Oct, Weds 15<sup>th</sup> Nov, Weds 7<sup>th</sup> Feb. All 4.00-7.30. The programme also offers a bursary scheme for those wanting to start their business but might need some more support to do this.

In the dying minutes of the match, with the lightning forming an impressive backdrop, Jamie stole the ball from the All Hallows' centre back and scored his second to round out an impressive first game victory for the A's in the Under 13 Premiership.




