








House Charity Week




A 'Shrektacular' night!


Soaring Success on S Block!

With an apprenticeship, you are doing a job for 80% of the time and then using the remaining 20% to work towards a qualification in that industry. Plus, you are getting paid for it whilst you are doing it. For many, this is becoming a very popular alternative to full-time college courses.






