Year 7 Home Learning

For the last two weeks of term, staff will be gradually switching to setting Home Learning tasks on Google Classroom (syncing with EduLink) but they will continue to ask students to write a brief entry in the paper planners (i.e. subject name + see EduLink/GC + due date). Whilst Year 7 students seem to be adapting really well to using their new iPads, we feel they will still benefit from the gradual switchover.

From 2nd January onwards, paper planners will no longer be used and all Home Learning will need to be accessed via EduLink/GC.

'Pitching' languages through football

This week, Year 9 Language students were treated to a wonderful talk given by Steve Eadon who works for a company called Mingalaba. Their mission is to promote languages through football. Their premise being that football is a common thread and therefore a topic that people easily relate to.

Steve gave a brief outline of his career in football and his work for Arsenal FC promoting football around the world. At school, he had reluctantly learnt German, but surprisingly went on to study it at A Level and at University, as well as Spanish. He felt that having these languages at his disposal opened doors for him, in terms of his career that wouldn't otherwise have been there.

His stint at Arsenal FC saw him travel to Kenya coaching groups of more than 200 children, often accompanied by roaming cattle, which was followed by a trip to Barbados. He was a little perplexed by his secondments, and on his return to Arsenal, asked why they hadn't made use of his 2 languages, German and Spanish. They explained that it wasn't just his languages that were an asset, but the fact that he was culturally aware, adaptable, up for a challenge and resilient.


This was an important message that he wanted to pass onto our students. He was keen for them to see the learning of a language as a valuable tool and not just another school subject. Having a language skill is seen as a real benefit and can put candidates head and shoulders above other applicants when it comes to looking for a job. He promoted 'having a go' and not being afraid to make mistakes. He also talked about English players in the men's and women's game who now play for foreign teams who felt that out of respect for their clubs, they should learn the respective language.

One of his slides detailing the number of languages that foreign players speak was quite impressive. Clearly they are known for their footballing prowess, however a large number also speak more than one language.

He finished by saying that it is easy to accept that English is one of the most commonly spoken languages. However, by learning a language and being prepared to use it, earns you respect, provides opportunities, widens your friendship group and opens doors to a more fulfilling future.





















DND Club is a huge success!
