




Important Information for Year 7

Grappling Greatness!

Serina in 8H has had some absolutely outstanding achievements during 2023 in Brazilian Ju-Jitsu. She is currently ranked number 1 in the world for her weight category and in the top 10 in the world across all weight classes within Grey belt category.

Serina has won 8 gold medals at county and national level during 2023 and one gold at international level competing in the Europeans.

She has already been promoted to solid grey belt from grey and white belt and was awarded 'Most improved Grey Belt Student of the Year 2023' from her Head Instructor at Carlson Gracie, Farnborough.

In 2024, Serina will be sponsored to compete at the Pan America's and possibly in Brazil as well.

<u>Year 10 'Post-16 Progression & Work Experience' Information Evening</u> Monday 22nd January 7-8 pm (Main Hall)



A reminder that we have our Year 10 'Post-16 Progression and Work Experience' evening coming up on Monday 22^{nd} January 7-8 pm in the Main Hall. We will be giving you information on how we support the Key Stage 4 students with their next steps and post-16 plans, as well as launching the Year 10 Work Experience programme which takes place this coming June 2024. There will also be an opportunity to hear from local post-16 providers at the evening. These providers will be available on stands, from 6.30 pm prior to the presentation, and again afterwards for any questions you may have.

Activate Learning Centres - Year 10/11 Taster Sessions (Merrist Wood, Guildford and Farnham Colleges)

Between January and May 2024, students in Year 10 and 11 will be able to sign up to bespoke taster sessions on campus, aimed at helping them make informed decisions about their next steps. Each session will be completely tailored to a Career Pathway and provide students with the opportunity to sample an activity related to the course, view the facilities, and ask the tutors questions about studying with Activate Learning. <u>Year 11 students- interested in a career in Medicine or Dentistry? King's College, London Lecture Programme</u> 2024

For those Year 11s potentially considering pursuing a career in the competitive fields of Medicine and Dentistry, applications are now open for the free, online, and national <u>King's College London Medicine and Dentistry Lecture</u>

<u>Series 2024</u> This programme is for students across the UK in Year 11, 12, and 13, who have only attended non-selective state schools since age 11 and are interested in becoming a doctor or dentist.

For over three years, this online programme has supported students in accessing the hypercompetitive medical and dental degrees by acting as a **hub of support** for their questions and queries. Lectures will be held on Wednesday evenings from 6.00-7.15pm. Our first lecture will be on Wednesday 14th February.

Over the course of the lecture programme, students will hear from a variety of speakers to help them make the best application to medicine or dentistry possible! Last year's lectures included the following:

- Medical and dental specialities: paediatrics, prosthodontics, renal transplant, maxillofacial and many more!
- · Q&A's each week with current medical and dental students.
- · Support for the application process: UCAT, personal statements, and interviews.
- · September Q&A with key admissions colleagues in the school of medicine at KCL, UCL, St George's, Queen Mary, and Imperial.
- A session on other careers in healthcare with six professionals currently working and teaching in the sector (nursing, dietetics, clinical science, etc.)

Tomlinscote Trip Statistics for 2023

As a school Tomlinscote uses a software package called Evolve. It is an online system for the planning, approval and management of educational visits, sports fixtures and extracurricular activities.

At the end of 2023 Evolve provided us with some statistics highlighting the number of visits, type of visit and number of students involved. The numbers involved help to demonstrate Tomlinscote's commitment to enhancing our students' educational journeys.

Consultation on changes to Gordon's Admission Arrangements for 2025/26

Gordon's School is consulting on its proposed admission arrangements for 2025/26. The key changes to the admissions arrangements are as follows:

Main School Policy

Sibling Criteria - Clarification of when the sibling must be on roll. Academic year prior not Calendar Year (see paragraphs 3b, 3e, 5b, 5d and 5f).

Sixth Form Policy

- Sibling criteria Change to when the sibling must be on roll At the time of application (see paragraph 5c)
- Addition of 'children of staff' within the oversubscription criteria (see paragraph 5d)
 Addition of 'students who have been awarded Scholarships' within the oversubscription criteria (see paragraph 5f and Appendix 2)
