Dear Year 11 Parent/Carer,

I hope you found the recent Progress evening and the parental Subject Revision evening useful. I have attached some slides from the Subject Revision evening for English, Maths and Science. I would also like to inform you about several areas of support that are on offer for our Year 11 students leading up to their exams.

There are two main after school interventions that staff are offering detailed in the table below. Some students have been targeted for specific interventions whereas others are optional. If students have been identified for targeted tutoring sessions, then they should prioritise these over the voluntary drop-in sessions. If students have been targeted, parents and students will have been notified via EduLink/SIMS InTouch.

As you know, we will be assessing students in another round of Mock exams in March. This presents an opportunity for students to sit and receive feedback on a second or third paper in many of their subjects. The generic March exam timetable is also attached; this does not show exam venues at the moment, students will be informed of this via EduLink after half-term.

## **Scheme of Revision**

I just wanted to remind you to point your child in the direction of the scheme of revision if they find themselves procrastinating over what to revise. Students should have now analysed their strengths and weaknesses for each subject and be in a position to plot out which areas to focus their revision on for each session to help address some of their gaps.

We know it is a busy period for our Year 11 students and families but the package we have put together, along with your support, will help them to achieve great results this year. The key to their success will be in establishing a strong revision routine early on and having the discipline to stick to their plan.
