How do I get a job working with animals?


Working with animals can be a very competitive area to get into, so it will be helpful for you to gain volunteering or work experience in this area. Consider the job role that you want to do and check the entry requirements carefully.

If you would like to be a Vet, you will need to have top GCSE grades and you will need to study A level Biology, Chemistry and Maths.

Many of the other roles can be accessed by studying Animal Management courses at college.

What skills are needed?

Depending on the role you would like, the skills needed will differ. Common skills include:



- An interest in animals and biology
- Patience and the ability to remain calm in stressful situations
- Active listening skills
- Customer Service skills
- To be thorough and to pay attention to detail
