The Court Moor Partnership is a consortium of local secondary schools and sixth form colleges in Hampshire and Surrey. We are proud to lead the consortium, and to have trained and recruited many trainees over the years.

The partnership works in collaboration with the University of Reading, which is one of the most successful ITT providers in the country. They are renowned for their knowledge of the sector, and they provide exemplary training in behaviour management, how to plan lessons, building a presence in the classroom, and the science of how children learn.



### How the course works—what you need to know...

You will train in two secondary schools, but you will know from the interview stage where they will be—so there are no nasty surprises when the course begins. The placements are of equal length, so you will get a real opportunity to establish yourself in both schools. You will also get to teach some sixth-form lessons at either Farnborough Sixth Form College or Queen Mary's College in Basingstoke.

The University of Reading training is predominantly in the autumn term, as you are beginning to find your feet in school. To begin with, you will observe lessons across the school, and get to know your way around. As you gain confidence, you will begin to deliver lessons, under the careful guidance of your dedicated mentor, who will meet with you every week to discuss your progress and set new targets for development. Your mentor will be in regular contact with your university tutor, ensuring a successful and effective three-way relationship.

Throughout both placements, the university training will be supplemented by weekly 'Professional Studies' training organised by Court Moor School.



To be eligible to train, you must have a degree (preferably a 2.2 or above), plus either 'O'-level grade C or GCSE grade 4 in both maths and English.

If your degree is in a subject other than the one you wish to teach, or if it has been five years or more since graduating, you may be able to complete a Subject Knowledge Enhancement course—there are even bursaries available to support your study. 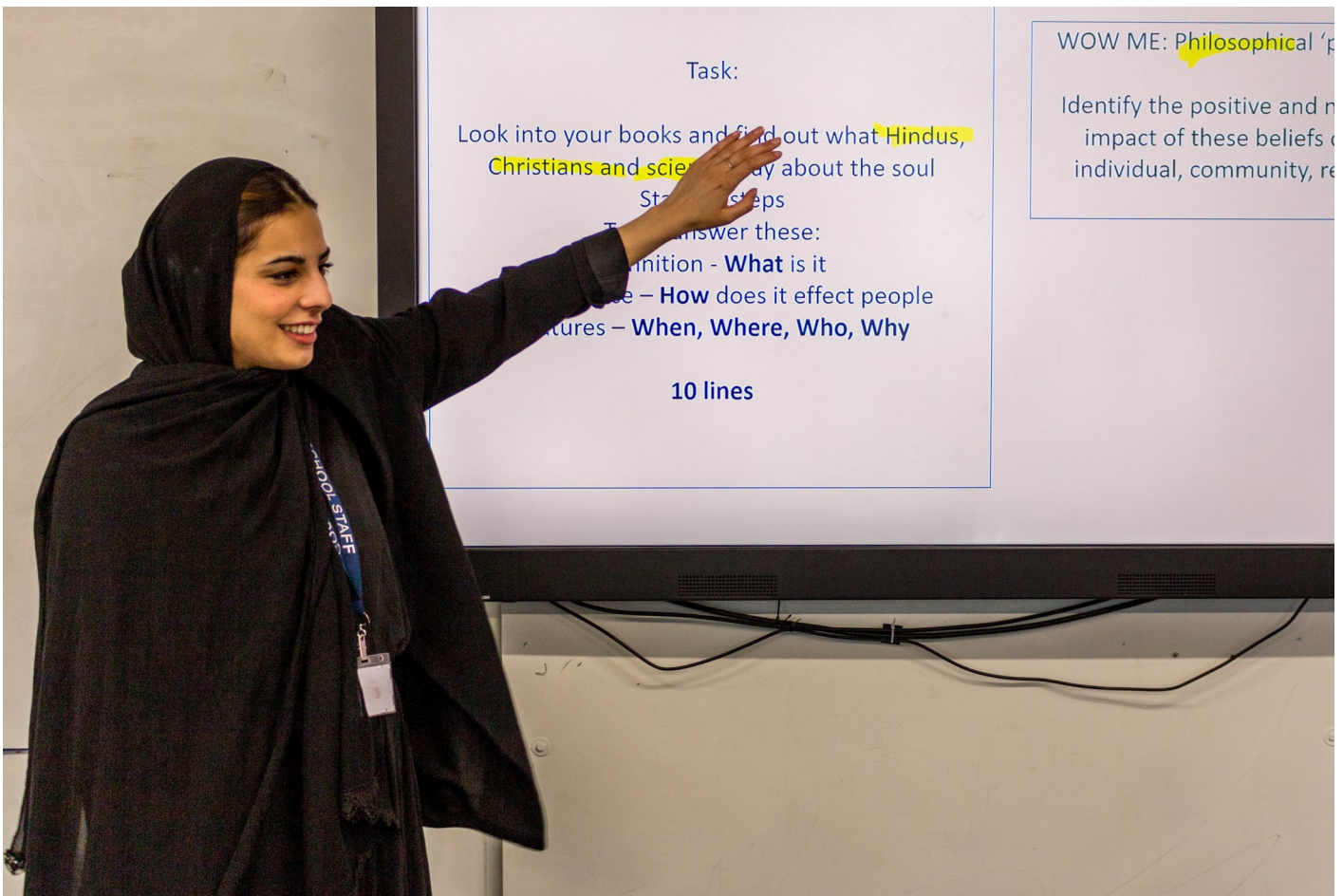
