Re: Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination

The HPV vaccine is a single dose vaccine, offered to both girls and boys in year 8. The HPV virus increases the risk of developing some cancers in later life, such as cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers and some cancers of the anus and genital areas. Evidence is clear that the HPV vaccine helps protect both boys and girls from HPV-related cancers.
