Do you have a passion for inspiring young minds and shaping the future? A career in teaching could be your perfect path. Teachers play a crucial role in guiding and nurturing students at various stages of their education.

Job Roles in Teaching

There are numerous roles in the teaching sector, including:

- Primary School Teacher
- Secondary School Teacher
- Special Educational Needs (SEN) Teacher
- Teaching Assistant
- Early Years Educator
- Further Education (FE) Lecturer

How to Become a Teacher



The route will vary depending on the age group you would like to teach:

Primary and Secondary School Teachers: Typically require A levels (often including subjects relevant to your teaching area), followed by a degree and a teaching qualification such as:

- PGCE (Postgraduate Certificate in Education)
- QTS (Qualified Teacher Status)

Teaching Assistants: May enter through direct application, experience, or apprenticeships.

Further Education Lecturers: Often require expertise in their subject area alongside relevant teaching experience.

Alternative Routes into Teaching

School Direct (on-the-job training)

Teach First (Leadership-focused teacher training)

Apprenticeships (especially for Teaching Assistants).

Keep an eye out for the new Teaching Degree Apprenticeships!



Key Skills for Teaching Roles

Successful teachers often demonstrate:

- Communication and Listening Skills
- Patience and Empathy
- Classroom Management Skills
- Adaptability and Creativity
- Strong Organisational and Time Management Skills
